ORDER TO SEAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS UNDER SECTION 943.059, FLORIDA STATUTES, AND FLORIDA RULE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE 3.692

THIS CAUSE having come to be heard before me this date upon a petition to seal certain records of the Petitioner's arrest on the Petitioner's arrest on the Petitioner's arrest on the Petitioner's arrest on the Perisonal Identification Information, Florida Statute § 817.568(2)(a), (ii) Fraudulent Use of Personal Identification Information, Florida Statute § 817.568(2)(a), (iii) Fraudulent Use of Credit Card to Obtain More Than \$100 In Value, Florida Statute § 817.61, (iii) Unlawful Possession of a Stolen Credit or Debit Card, Florida Statute § 817.60(8), and (iv) Petit Theft, Florida Statute § 812.014(3)(a), (v) Grand Theft in the Third Degree, Florida Statute § 812.014(3)(c)(1), and re-arrest on the Orange County Sheriff's Office, for: (vi) Grand Theft in the Third Degree, Florida Statute § 812.014(3)(c), (vii)-(ix) Dealing in Stolen Property (Trafficking), Florida Statute § 812.019(1), (x)-(xii) Receiving Money from Pawnbroker by False Verification, Florida Statute § 539.001(8)(b)(8)(a), and the court having heard argument of counsel, reviewed the available record and/or being otherwise fully advised in the premises, the court hereby finds:

- 1. The Petitioner has never been previously adjudicated guilty of a criminal offense or a comparable ordinance violation, nor adjudicated delinquent for committing a felony or a misdemeanor specified in §§ 943.051(3)(b) or 943.0584, Florida Statutes.
- 2. The Petitioner was not adjudicated guilty of nor adjudicated delinquent for committing any of the acts stemming from the arrest or criminal activity to which the instant petition pertains.
 - 3. The Petitioner has not secured prior records expunction or sealing.
- A Certificate of Eligibility has been issued by the Department of Law Enforcement and accompanied the petition for sealing of nonjudicial criminal history records.

WHEREUPON IT IS:

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the petition to seal is hereby granted. All judicial and non-judicial criminal history records pertaining to case number and case number, and for which the court finds both dates of arrest taking place on and on to be directly related, shall be sealed in accordance with the procedures set forth in Florida Rule of Criminal Procedure 3.692; and it is further

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the clerk of this court shall forward a certified copy of this Order to the State Attorney's Office for Orange County and the Orange County Sheriff's Office, who will comply with the procedures set forth in § 943.059, Florida Statutes, and appropriate regulations of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, and who will further forward a copy of this order to any agency, state and federal, as well as those listed hereinbelow, that their records reflect has received the instant criminal history record information; and it is further

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Orange County Sheriff's Office and any agency, state and federal, that their records reflect has received the instant criminal history record information shall seal and completely remove all information concerning indicia of arrest or criminal history record information regarding the arrest or alleged criminal activity to which this petition pertains in accordance with the procedures set forth in § 943.059, Florida Statutes, and Florida Rule of Criminal Procedure 3.692.

All costs of certified copies involved herein are to be borne by the Petitioner.
